Gambling Disorder occurs when someone is unable to control their gambling activities, and as a result, several areas of their lives may be negatively impacted.

It is estimated that this chronic, progressive disorder impacts the lives of over five million people in the United States.

Some warning signs include:

- Gambling more than planned
- Trouble paying bills/debts
- Lying about where money goes
- Borrowing to continue gambling
- Chasing losses
- Problems at home, work or school
