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What is Interactive Gaming?

"Any gambling game offered through the use of communications technology that allows a person, utilizing money, checks, electronic checks, electronic transfers of money, credit cards or any other instrumentality to transmit electronic information to assist in the placement of a bet or wager and corresponding information related to the display of the game, game outcomes or other similar information."

(PA General Assembly, Act 42, 2017)

Brief History of Online Gambling

- InterCasino became the first internet gambling site to accept an online wager in January 1996
- Online gambling rapidly expanded primarily into sport/race books and casinos based in the Caribbean and Central America
- A lack of consistency in law, regulation and policy prevails, with jurisdictions taking wildly divergent approaches to online gambling and confusion among consumers


Online Gambling Research

- O Lack of responsible gambling practices in implementation
 - O Accessibility
 - O Anonymity
 - O Spending
 - O Regulation
- O Link between online gambling and gambling problems

Online Gambling in the US

- Little research on online gambling with American's, what does exist has tended to show lower prevalence rates than other countries
 - O Much of this data collected before legalization
- O Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act of 2006
- O Legalization of online gambling in select regions

Online Gambling in Pennsylvania


- Legalized in 2017 through PA Act 42
- O First Licenses in 2018
- O Revenues 2021-2022
 - Over \$1.2 billion from iGaming (including slots, table games and poker)
 - Over \$267 million from online sports betting
 - Over \$27 million from fantasy sports (online and offline)

The Interactive Gaming Assessment

- O Legislated annual assessment of online gambling within the state
 - O Establish prevalence
 - O Evaluate problems
 - Monitor trends





Methods

- O Dual frame random digit dial survey between December 2020 and June 2021
- Those who are a Pennsylvania resident and 18 and older eligible to participate
- Asked to complete brief phone survey that takes about 5 minutes
 - O Demographics
 - Past year online/offline gambling formats
 - O Brief Problem Gambling Screen
 - 1-800-GAMBLER use

Methods


- O Calls made to 22,349 Cellphones and 16,803 Landlines
 - \odot 775 on cell phone completes
 - \odot 372 on landline completes
- O Response rate 10.3%

Sample

• Final sample was 1147 completes

- O 49.3% men
- Average age 53.98 (SD = 19.1; range 18-97)
- O By Region:
 - 10.8% North West
 - 7.0% North Central
 - 9.2% North East
 - 22.5% South West
 - 16.6% South Central
 - 33.9% South East
 - \odot 1.2% were PA residents with no county provided


Distribution of Online Gambling Participation by Region


Gambling Problems Among Online Gamblers

The percent of PYOGs that indicated they had presented with a particular gambling problem or the intent to control or reduce their online gambling.

In the past 12 months, would you say you have been preoccupied with gambling?	10.1
In the past 12 months, have you needed to gamble with larger amounts of money to get the same feeling of excitement?	12.5
In the past 12 months, have you often gambled longer, with more money or more frequently than you intended to?	22.5
In the past 12 months, have you borrowed money or sold anything to get money to gamble?	3.5
In the past 12 months, have you made attempts to either cut down, control or stop gambling?	29.3

Note: 1.8% of online gamblers did not respond to the questions regarding gambling problems.

Changes to the Survey

- O Removed screening questions about online/offline gambling
- O Addition of motives question
- O Addition of motives for ending gambling session question
- Addition of questions on beliefs about gambling harms/benefits and legality

Methods


- Calls made to 22,349 Cellphones and 16,803 Landlines
 - O 922 Landlines completed
 - O 1031 Cellphones completed
- O Response rate 10.3%
- O Brief phone survey with modified questions from year 1

Sample


• Final sample was 1953 completes and 40 partial completes

- Weighting procedures left a final sample of 2003
- After weighting:
 - O 49.3% males
 - Average age 49.72 (SD = 18.34)
 - O By Region:
 - O 14.6% North West
 - O 14.0% North Central
 - O 10.3% North East
 - 21.0% South West
 - O 13.9% South Central
 - O 25.0% South East
 - O 1.2% were PA residents with no county provided

The percent of PYOGs that indicated they had presented with a particular gambling problem or the intent to control or reduce their online gambling.



In the past 12 months, would you say that you need to gamble with larger amounts of money to get the same feeling of excitement?	9.7%
In the past 12 months, have you often gambled longer, with more money, or more frequently than you intended to?	9.9%
In the past 12 months, have you made attempts to either cut down, control, or stop gambling?	26.5%
In the past 12 months, have you borrowed money, or sold anything, to get money to gamble?	0%

Note: 16.3% of online gamblers did not respond to the questions regarding gambling problems.








Motivations to End an Online Gambling Session


